L. Department Head Reports:

Fire Chief Brian Tucker reported 25 incidents, 7 for aircraft stand by, 5 commercial alarms, 4 smoke investigations, 2 residential fires and several additional incidents.

Water Superintendent Billy Wood stated they were staying busy with leaks.

Police Chief Craig Moates started his service report reported 1,114 calls for service. 457 security checks, 137 vehicle stops, 78 citizens assist, 54 Investigations 10-43, 51 traffic control and various other calls. Chief Moates also spoke about the successful search warrant they had done which produced 16 weapons being removed from the property.

Marvin Kalinowski with Public Works stated they were finishing leaf pick up. This week was household pickup. They also had been cleaning ditches.

Philip Morrissett for the Codes Department stated he had the mayor had been working on a letter that hopefully would get things done quicker. He stated that he had one individual on notice about their issues. Councilperson Young stated that at the Blue Oval meeting it was brought up that new industries come through a town and if that town is a mess, they moved on to another place.
