K. Citizens Input:

Lisa Solinger who resides 258 Old Humboldt Rd in Jackson, TN but owns property at 761 & 763 Highland asked that her property not be changed from B2 to R2.

Mayor Griffin asked if she was aware if the property was destroyed by fire or wind, etc., it could not be rebuilt as a residence in the commercial district, but if that was her desire, we could have it excluded.

L. Department Head Reports:

Fire Chief Brian Tucker stated they are still busy working on the 1st responder program, hoping to have staff at the Sweet Tea Festival. They are also working on the brush trucks, had four (4) air packs delivered today, there were four (4) delivered today, four (4) coming with the truck and twelve (12) included in the grant. They have ordered the Fire Pup suit and a small fire

truck that they will use when visiting the school to help with their fire prevention activities. They had had 7 commercial alarms, 9 aircraft standbys, 2 structure fires, 3 medical calls, 3-MVA-no injuries, 2 grass fires, 1 cancelled enroute, 1 vehicle fire and 1 camper/RV fire for a total of 31 calls.

Water Superintendent Billy Wood said that leaks were slowing down with the cooler temperatures. Street repairs should be starting in the next few weeks. He was in the process of getting a price on a better system for topography.

Police Chief White stated that his department had answered 1,763 calls for the month of July. 938 of these were security checks for homes/business/parks, 280 vehicle stops, 103 10-43 investigations, 100 citizen assist, 50 medical and 292 various assists. He also mentioned that he was happy to welcome Jackie Sykes back for the SRO position.

Superintendent Johnny Mercer with Public Works stated his department had been busy patching pot holes and trimming trees for the school buses. They were continuing to stay busy with their monthly household and brush pick up.

Parks Director Billy Hollowell stated there had just been a cross county jamboree at the park. Ten schools participated with 500-600 in attendance. Thanked Public Works for helping to get a tree removed. Fall soccer league would be starting soon.

Jim Seaton said all four of the quarantined properties have been released. Mayor Griffin stated That the gentlemen from Dyersburg who had worked with Jim through this process spoke highly of him getting all the paperwork organized.

L. Council Reports:

Mayor Griffin that there had been a bid opening on July 18th at 11:00 a.m. for the new 2022 sewer system rehabilitation on the pump stations for the city. Mr. Jim Hilborn opened the three (3) received bids from B.A.M. 2, Inc for \$ 329,953.00, Barsto Construction Co. for \$ 447,466.60 and Norris Bros. Excavating, LLC for \$ 690,540.00. Mr. Hilborn stated that he felt that each bidder had complied with the rules and regulations of the State Contractor's Licensing Board and with this being said, B.A.M. 2, Inc was recommended to be awarded the Bid based on price and that they were an experienced and had successfully completed several similar projects.

Mayor Griffin advised the council that we had also received notice to proceed with construction on the downtown sidewalks with A2H.

The Sweet Tea Festival is approaching August 25 & 26 and there would be a celebrity dunking booth featuring Police Chief White, Fire Chief Tucker, him and some other police officers along with fire department officers.

Councilperson Batton stated she would like to thank Mayor Griffin for sending her the list of city priorities that were discussed at the council workshop.

Vice Mayor Townes wanted to thank all the department heads for doing a good job.

Councilperson Alexander stated he agreed with Vice Mayor Townes and added that he felt working together was a big plus.

Councilperson Young said he just wanted to mention that our school was starting football season and the kids would be doing a good job and needed our support.
