k. Council Discussion/Reports

Councilperson Hale asked for an update on the restart of the sewer project. Mayor Winchester told the council the sewer project would restart on the 6th of August on Magnolia Street and last for approximately three (3) weeks. I have contacted several truck lines that a detour around this area will commence on this date. I suggested to Wal-Mart since they have a large contract with Mars Pet Care to use Bell Store Road during this period. Spinks Clay Company is another company contacted and they have agreed to use an alternate route.

Councilperson Davis asked what effect this would have on the school buses since school would be starting. Mayor Winchester said he thought there were two (2) buses that traveled this route and hopefully the buses will be through this area before the work starts of a morning and the work will have stopped by the time the school buses travel the route in the afternoons. The mayor said he would contact Mr. Ward and Ms. Tucker about this situation.

Mayor Winchester told the council the street department had installed a bridge across the ditch on College Drive and the Bethel apartments and they painted the bridge Bethel colors.

Councilperson Hale asked what the big culverts were at the city park. Mayor Winchester told him they were for the new road that was cut to the new Verizon tower. Verizon agreed to put in a new culvert off Liberty Lane for the new road. This will help the flow of water coming down Liberty Lane from the ballparks.

Mayor Winchester also told the council the new Lepanto Restaurant will be opening at 10:30 tomorrow. The New Mexican restaurant still progressing and should open within three (3) weeks. The Hwy 79 project has begun construction and the new car wash is under construction. The city appreciates the capital investments these businesses are putting into our city.

Mayor Winchester congratulated Joel Washburn with the McKenzie Banner and Shirley Nanney with the Carroll County News-Leader for the awards they recently won.

Mayor Winchester asked for a working session after the next council meeting to go over the animal ordinance. A date and time will be determined later.
