b. Sawyer Phipps, Troop 78 presented the Eagle Scout project of a U.S. Flag Retirement Box to be placed in front of the Governor Gordon Browning Museum for citizens to place old flags so they can be officially retired. K. Department Head Reports:

Fire Chief Tucker stated they had 41 calls for the month of October and tied with May for the busiest 2 months of the year. They responded to vehicle fires, vehicle accidents, and smoke scares. They were in service for roughly 16 hours. He added they are working on cleaning up around the city hall with trimming.

Water Superintendent Billy Wood stated his department was doing their regular job of taking care of the city's water and fixing leaks. The paving crew is fixing holes from water cuts.

Philip Morrisett for the Codes Department reported that there had been several houses that been condemned and he is still working on those, some have been torn down while a few others have been sold to new owners.

Police Chief Moates stated they responded to 1,440 calls.

Johnny Mercer with Public Works stated has been trimming trees, leaf season seems to be later this year, servicing equipment and putting up Christmas lights. He also said the brush truck would be here the week after Thanksgiving.

Parks Director Billy Hollowell stated they had been working on getting the parks, Splash Pad and restrooms winterized. Mowing has slowed down, so they will get all parked trimmed and ready for winter. They have been putting up Christmas decorations getting ready for the Mistletoe Christmas. The Gaga Pit should be installed the first week of December and that change was due to conflict Duane Patrick had with the original install date.

Mayor Holland reminded the council about car leasing for the Fire and Police Departments. There will be a workshop December 9th at 5:00 P.M.

Mayor Holland also spoke about the Mistletoe Christmas coming up in December. Programs will be put in council boxes. TCAT students worked on the mistletoe ball that will be placed in Veteran's Park. We will be featured again in Jackson's VIP magazine.
